Lauderdale Lakes Lake Management District

Nominations and Running for Office

Eligibility to Serve

To serve as an elected lake district commissioner, a person must be a U.S. citizen, eighteen years of age or older, and either an elector (resident voter) or an owner of property within the district.

At least one elected commissioner must be a district resident, unless no resident is willing to serve. If no resident is willing to serve, this requirement is waived until the end of that term.

Nominations

The Board shall nominate candidates to fill all vacancies on the Board.

If none of the remaining elected commissioners, whose terms do not expire, are resident electors, then all of the candidates for one of the vacant positions shall be resident electors.

Any five electors may nominate additional candidates by submitting written nomination papers to the secretary and a written consent signed by the nominated candidate stating his/her willingness to serve and fulfill the duties of the position at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting.

Ballots

The names of all nominated candidates shall appear on the written and published notices of the annual meeting.

Nominations are due at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting (the Saturday of Labor Day weekend) to allow for printing of ballots.

Ballots printed for the election shall provide space for write-in candidates.

Terms of Office

Commissioners are elected to three-year terms that are staggered.
